As a living museum, our cultivated gardens, arboretum, and natural areas serve as outdoor classrooms for instruction across seven Cornell colleges and host research that seeks to address some of our world's most pressing problems. We steward the university's iconic gorges and natural areas, and conduct vital conservation efforts.

Geranium Walk \$100,000



The Geranium Walk offers a unique, meditative stroll down a core axis of the botanic gardens. Nestled between the rustic wooden fence line of the renowned Robison York State Herb Garden and the historic stone wall foundation of the sweeping Hillside Garden, it provides intimate views in both directions as well as the long view ahead. With its Mediterranean micro-climate of sun-warmed stone, it's the perfect habitat for an evolving display of hardy geraniums that tumble along the walkway.

Streambank Native Plant Garden (aka Native Rock Garden)

\$250,000

Located just outside the fence of the Mundy Wildflower Garden, on one of the heavily used trails along the banks of Fall Creek, this open meadow has a wonderful view of the creek's small waterfalls. The area on the near bank was reconstructed about 2014 to stop erosion into the creek, then planted with native wildflowers that are naturalizing into a rock garden. The sound if the water is soothing, and it is a natural spot to sit and contemplate.



North Walk \$250,000



The North Walk borders the Robison York State Herb Garden, with a straight gravel path dividing the garden into two long borders that run east to west between the Ground Cover Collection and Judd Falls Road. It houses a curated collection of small flowering trees, shrubs, and hardy perennials native to North American interplanted with non-hardy plants that are native to Central and South America.



Hillside Garden \$350,000

The Hillside Garden spans the slope above the Herb, Flower, and Winter Gardens. Features spreading groundcovers good for stabilizing slopes—including gray dogwood and cut-leaf stephanandra as well as a mixed planting of shrubs effectively functioning as groundcover.



Ground Cover Collection (aka Sunken Garden)

\$350,000



The ground cover collection nests into a shady glade between the Nevin Welcome Center and wraps around the Lewis Education Building. The collection includes a wide range of plants that make ideal groundcovers for shady or sunny areas.
